

BASIC RIGGER

OHSCER222A – PERFORM BASIC RIGGING OPERATIONS

OVERVIEW: The basic rigging certificate encompasses the requirements for the dogging licence (certificate). It is preferable that an applicant for the basic rigging licence (certificate) already holds a dogging licence or has previously passed a practical skills assessment for the dogging licence. Otherwise the assessment for an applicant for the basic rigging certificate must incorporate the requirements of both the dogging and basic rigging licence assessment.

NOMINAL DURATION: Up to 40 Hrs (Training Only). Please note a further 120 hr nominal period involving completing a log book (on the job) maybe required prior to assessment.

PREREQUISITES: Participants must be the holder of a dogger licence and should have sufficient literacy and numeracy skills to read and comprehend instructions for working safely.

ASSESSMENT AND AWARD: On successful completion of the course including the assessment, the participant will receive a nationally recognised Statement of Attainment and be issued with an Occupational Health & Safety Certificate to perform basic rigging operations. Participants who demonstrate competency by passing the theory, written and verbal assessments will receive a Statement of Attainment for partial completion of the Nationally Recognised Training Package – 30497QLD Course in Operating Crane Rigging and Scaffolding Equipment
